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Dear Sir/Ms.

As an introduction I kindly ask you to read my article: "Kongeriket Norge: Fritt, selvstendig, folkestyrt, eller?" (In English: The Kingdom of Norway: Free, independent, democratic, or?).

The content of this article, in particular the correspondence between Mr. Erik Brofoss (former Minister of Finance, head of the Norwegian National Bank and director of IMF) and Mr. Andreas Cappelen (former Minister of Finance), uncovers severe violations of the Norwegian constitution as well as outmanoeuvred and neutralized political parties and representatives in the Parliament. In addition the reader will get a view of how the Norwegian people have been ruled – and under what regime – since before the WWII; by a Labour Party-controlled dictatorship.

In 1984 two Norwegian newspapers made attempts to investigate the matter in question – the so called Norway Scheme – with no luck. Two of the main characters in this scheme, former Prime Minister Einar Gerhardsen and the former Minister of Finance Andreas Cappelen, were asked by the journalists about Norway Scheme and their knowledge to it. They replied that they had no knowledge to the matter what so ever, this contrary to what they reveal in their classified correspondence (mentioned in my article) which basically concerned the Norway Scheme (aka the Hambro-arrangement) and its severe constitutional consequences.

This statement in 1984 clarifies the answer to the question whether the dictatorship has continued or not. Putting a lid on the matter instead of clearing it up, reveals that the unconstitutional political regime of the 1950' to the 1980' (the Labour Party-dictatorship) has continued up till today, as the severe constitutional violations and the unlawful and unconstitutional agreements between the Labour party and the other parties in the Parliament were never even attempted to be disclosed or nullified. Consequently the people of Norway and the voters have been betrayed by the Parliament and this concealed dictatorship since 1945, at the latest.

This means that the political situation (the Labour Party-dictatorship and its regime) – as it appeared in the 1950', in 1965, in 1970 and in 1984 – still prevails.

In turn the consequences of this unlawful political situation will obviously affect the general election in Norway, which is to be held on September 14 2009, as this election thus is based upon deception.

While the voters is taught to *believe* that they will have their say through their representatives in the Parliament, the reality in Norway is that the representatives are tied hand and foot even before they enter the Parliament, only allowed to act in accordance with the secret and unconstitutional agreements disclosed in the correspondence between Brofoss and Cappelen, mentioned above.


“We have an asset to protect: Position of trust between our party and our voters. At the end of the day, the election is a question of trust. Nothing counts if there is no conformity between promises and results, between ability, will, and performance. Honesty is the best policy, also in politics.” Mr. Haakon Lie, departing Party Secretary of the Norwegian Labour Party (Arbeiderpartiet), in his speech to the National Congress, 1969.

Although neither the departing Party Secretary Lie nor the rest of the Labour party complied with this maxim, he was obviously right in his evaluation of the law. An election based on lies, deception and violations against the Constitution, does not count.

In accordance with the Norwegian Municipal and Parliament election Act (Valgloven 2002) §13-1, I petition the Board of the Parliament election (Riksvalgstyret) to postpone the election until an appointed truth-commission based on the frameworks of the South African Truth and Reconciliation commission (TRC) has 1) probed the Norwegian political system, the administrative regime, the Labour Party and its violations against the people and the constitution as well as the other parties' violations against the people and the constitution, and 2) has delivered its decision.
